Past continuous / progressive

- We use the past continuous / progressive to describe an action, that was happening in the past and lasted some time.
- The action is already ended.
- We create the past continuous by **transforming** verb **TO BE** into the **past tense**.

Past continuous / progressive

| I am working from home this month. | I was working from home last month. | |
|---|--|--|
| They are watching TV this evening. | They were watching TV last evening. | |
| My parents are gardening. | My parents were gardening. | |
| Henry is playing computer games. | Henry was playing computer games. | |
| The Everly brothers are singing a song together. | The Everly brothers were singing a song together. | |
| My cat is quite stubborn. | My cat was quite stubborn. | |
| Hanna is playing the violin in her room. | Hanna was playing the violin in her room. | |
| Their house is for sale this week. | Their house was for sale last week. | |
| John's parents-in-law are very pleasant. | John's parents-in-law were very pleasant. | |
| We are celebrating my son's birthday today. | We were celebrating my son's birthday yesterday. | |

Past continuous / progressive

 Question – we move the verb TO BE at the beginning of the sentence

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She was cooking dinner. Was she cooking dinner?
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• Negative – we add "not" to the verb TO BE

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They were studying French.
They were not studying French.
They weren't studying French.
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"Used to" phrase

 This is very popular phrase for past tense. It explains that we loved doing something in the past but we don't do it anymore.

Used to = být zvyklý/zvyklá něco dělat, dělávat

I used to have a cat when I was a child.

They used to go to the church every Sunday.

Maria and me used to be the best friends.

My grandma used to bake cakes.

When we were young, we used to spend our summer holidays camping in the mountains.

Nowadays I don't have any cat.

They don't go to church anymore.

We aren't the best friends today.

She doesn't bake cakes anymore.

We are adults now.
